This professional development course, offered in collaboration between Regional Plan Association, the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy, and the Orange County Department of Planning, will explain innovative design and land-use law techniques for combating sprawl development. Structured around the handbook *Redesigning the Edgeless City*, the course draws on case study work by the faculty from across North America on topics including re-making the suburban highway, turning “edge city” districts into compact mixed-use centers, and using “green infrastructure” strategies for shaping new communities at the metropolitan fringe.

The second day of the course will consist of a hands-on design workshop to demonstrate the application of these strategies to central Orange County. The Mid-County region includes the Towns of Goshen, Wawayanda, Walkill, and Crawford, the Village of Goshen, and the City of Middletown and represents a full spectrum of assets and challenges ranging from historic centers and agricultural landscapes to low intensity strip commercial and sprawling residential development.

Planning and policy advocates, city and state officials, developers, and citizen stakeholders are encouraged to enroll. Registration is \$50 and participants qualify for 13 AICP and AIA continuing education credits.
